TIPS FOR A SUSTAINABLE AUTUMN

As we transition from summer sunsets and beach days to crisp evenings and cozy sweaters, we can use this change of seasons as an opportunity to find new methods for incorporating sustainable practices. Here are some easy ways to be more conscience of the environment during the autumn season.



LEAVE THE LEAVES

Dead leaves are an important part of the natural cycles of plants and soil. The removal of dead leaves from this cycle can actually diminish the soil's health. Instead, consider leaving leaves on your lawn.



SAY NO TO DISPOSABLE

It's Pumpkin Spice Latte season! Enjoy your PSL (or other fave fall drink) in a reusable mug or tumbler. Many coffee shops will even offer a discount if you bring your own cup.



DECORATE SUSTAINABLY

Consider using natural decor, like fallen leaves, pinecones, or acorns, for centerpieces and wreaths. Buy quality, durable decorations that can be used for years to come. Find creative ways to convert recycled materials into decorations. All of these will help keep cheap plastic out of landfills.



DIY OR REUSE COSTUMES

Instead of buying a new costume, reuse an old costume or borrow one from a friend. You can even create your own costume out of recycled materials or things you have around the house. Check local thrift stores for costumes or additional props and accessories to finish the look. This can help save materials and money, and you will have a unique, handmade costume to show off!



COZY, CLEAN CANDLES

Candles make us feel cozy during the colder months, but did you know that traditional scented candles can contribute significantly to indoor air pollution? Many scented candles contain hazardous metals that can propagate in the air after only a few hours of burning. Consider buying non-toxic, environmentally friendly candles that are made from all-natural products such as beeswax or soy, are unscented and have paper or 100% cotton wicks.



BRING YOUR PLANTS INSIDE

As the cold temperatures arise, bring your plants indoors! This will protect them from the cold, but also clean the air inside and brighten up the interior of your home. of homes have smoke detectors that **do not** work or are missing batteries.

CHECK YOUR SMOKE DETECTORS



Working smoke alarms can double your chances of survival in a fire.



Replace batteries twice a year and keep alarms free of dust.



Smoke alarms should be installed on **every floor** of your home.



KNOW THE RISKS



There is a house fire **every ten** seconds in the U.S.



Home fires can spread in as little as **thirty seconds**.



Make sure that your family has a **fire escape plan** for your home and practice it regularly.



Cooking is the **leading cause** of house fires.



More than **15,000** fires a year are started by clothes dryers. Clean the vents at least once a year.



Remember: If there's ever a fire, GET OUT, STAY OUT and CALL for help.

MAINTAIN YOUR ELECTRICAL SYSTEM





Electrical fires can be caused by: broken wires, wire insulation drying out, loose switches or receptacles, and overheating caused by dirt and oil.



Get your electrical system checked by a licensed electrician **every four years**.



Faulty wiring is the number one cause of electrical fires. **The warning signs?** Flickering lights; breakers that always trip; fuses that blow; a burning smell when you plug in appliances; outlets and switches that spark; and discolored wall outlets.

Halloween started as a pre-Christian Celtic festival called Samhain, which means "summer's end." Held in the beginning of November, the feast recognized the last day of the fall harvest and spirits crossing over, since they believed the veil between the living and spirit world grew thinnest at that time. People in Ireland, the UK and Northern France used to ward off ghosts by lighting sacrificial bonfires, and – you guessed it – wearing costumes to trick the spirits. In medieval times in Scotland and Ireland, young people dressed up in costumes and went door-to-door looking for food or money in exchange for performing songs, poems or other "tricks." When the Irish fled the potato famine that devastated their country in the 1840s, they brought their Halloween traditions with them. The celebration spread across the country, until the observation of Halloween in America reached an all-time high in the 1920s.


